Pragmatism is a philosophical movement that includes those who claim that an ideology or proposition is true if it works satisfactorily, that the meaning of a proposition is to be found in the practical consequences of accepting it, and that unpractical ideas are to be rejected. Pragmatism: Definition and Philosophers Pragmatism is a philosophical school founded in the 19th century by philosophers and scientists who opposed the modern metaphysics (Hegel) and the dichotomy of theory / practice (Aristotle, Kant). The "founding fathers" are Peirce, James, Dewey, Mead (1850-1950) and "new pragmatists" are Rorty , Putnam, Quine, Goodman ( 1950-2000.
