Phlebotomy Procedure General collection supplies Hands must be washed prior to and after all phlebotomy procedures. Using soap and warm water, work up a generous lather, scrub vigorously for 10 to 15 seconds, rinse well and repeat. Use a clean paper towel to turn off the faucet. A hand sanitizer product can be used in place of soap and water.

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
